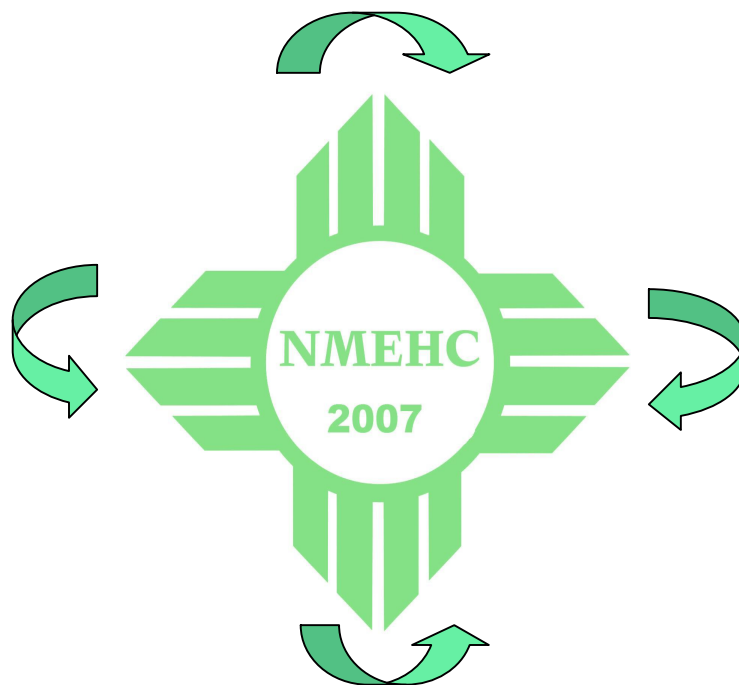

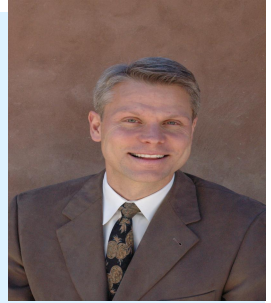

### Keynote Speakers



JOHN FOGARTY

#### Keynote Speaker—Monday, October 15 (10:30—11:30)

John Fogarty will speak on "Creating Bold Solutions to Global Warming: A Call to Action for the Environmental Health Community."

John is a physician trained in family medicine and public health. He serves on the national Board of Directors for Physicians for Social Responsibility where he is the chair of the Global Warming Committee and also is the Director of New Energy Economy.

Physicians for Social Responsibility has declared global warming to be the greatest public health challenge for our generation and is working to galvanize American health professionals to take bold action now. New Energy Economy recently convened a diverse group of experts who participated in Governor Richardson's Climate Change Advisory Group, which created a groundbreaking roadmap of global warming policy solutions for New Mexico.

As a physician he has worked with the Navajo and Pueblo people for the last decade, and in 2004 was awarded the Lannan Cultural Freedom Fellowship for his work in helping to protect Navajo communities from new uranium mining.

#### Keynote Speaker —Wednesday, October 17 (11:30—1:30)

David Gutzler will speak on "Environmental Health in an Era of Pronounced Climate Variability and Change."

David S. Gutzler is a professor in the Earth & Planetary Sciences Department and Water Resources Program at the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque. He received a B.S. from University of California, Berkeley, (Engineering Physics); a M.S. from University of Washington, (Atmospheric Sciences); a Ph.D. from Massachusetts Institute of Technology, (Meteorology). His previous professional appointments have been Visiting Fellow at University of Colorado, Boulder; Staff Scientist - Atmospheric & Environmental Research, Inc., at Cambridge, Mass.; Physicist - NOAA Aeronomy Laboratory, at Boulder, Colorado.

Gutzler's research interests include: Theory and observations of large-scale atmospheric variability and climate change; ocean-atmosphere and land surface-atmosphere interactions; predictability of weather, climate, and the hydrologic cycle; applications of climate information to socioeconomic issues.

Gutzler is referenced in more than 70 publications in scientific journals and books and has secured research grants from National Science Foundation and NOAA. He is a Certified Consulting Meteorologist #612, American Meteorological Society and a Former Editor, *Journal of Climate* (American Meteorological Society). Gutzler is also a member of national and international advisory panels for establishing climate prediction research priorities in the Americas.

## Special Short Course and Workshop

### Certified Pool Operator Course

Monday, October 13, 8:00 –noon, 1:00 pm - 4:30 pm, and  
Tuesday, October 14, 8:00 am – Noon, 1:00 pm - 4:30 pm

Whether you are a pool and spa operator, maintenance technician or a swimming pool regulator, this course is for you. The CPO course is designed to provide individuals with the basic knowledge and techniques and skills of pool and spa operation. Topics covered include filters and filtration, circulation and re-circulation equipment, chemical testing and treatments, spas and related pools, maintenance and management plans as well as energy management. Upon completing this two-day course and successfully passing the examination, you will be certified as a Certified Pool Operator through the National Swimming Pool Foundation (NSPF).



Cost: \$95 in addition to full 3-day NMEHC registration (\$200 before September 14 and \$235 after September 14) or \$240 without NMEHC registration (\$285 after September 14). Continental breakfasts and luncheons are included.

NOTE: A minimum of 20 students is required or the class will be cancelled. Deadline to register for this class is October 3rd.

### Fugitive Dust Control Workshop

The Albuquerque Environmental Health Department will be providing a Fugitive Dust Control Workshop for those who need to either receive certification or re-certification. There will be a morning session (8:30 am — 12:00 pm) and an afternoon session (1:00 pm — 4:30 pm) available. Workshop presentations will cover preparation of a fugitive dust control permit application, permit fees, enforcement/compliance issues, and fugitive dust control strategies.

The workshop will also include opportunities for department staff to answer questions and receive input from attendees concerning the fugitive dust program. All Participants at the workshops will be offered a brief test on Fugitive Dust Control. Those passing the test will receive a certification valid for two years to document a successful completion of the workshop.

Instructor: Billy Gallegos, Albuquerque Environmental Health Department, Environmental Health Supervisor.

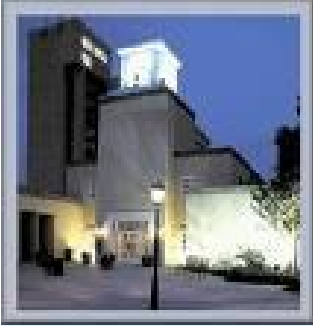
